Dear Friends,

We have certainly faced some challenges in 2009; however, we are beginning to look optimistically at 2010 and beyond. Planning is well underway across the entire agency with a continued goal of increased service to children and a sustainable funding base.

This fall has seen significant growth across our School Based Programs. With funding from the Ministry of Education for 2009/2010 we have welcomed an additional staff person to the School Team and formally launched Jump Math and School to Work. In addition we are currently piloting a Boys Mentoring Program in partnership with BBBSC, TDSB and TCDSB.

I am also pleased to report that BBBST received its formal Accreditation status through BBBSC in September, achieving 100% in Service Delivery and Organizational Management Standards. My thanks and congratulations are extended to the entire BBBST staff team for a job extremely well done!

The holiday season is upon us. It is my hope that you would consider a financial contribution to Big Brothers and Big Sisters again this year. At the close of 2008 we had successfully reduced our wait list to 225 children. With the economic downturn and the significant loss of jobs this year, families have turned to us looking for assistance. School To Work

BBBST is delighted to announce a new pilot program in partnership with Burger King Restaurants of Canada and Kipling Collegiate Institute. Modeled after a similar partnership with BBBS of Greater Miami and Burger King in the USA, the School To Work program matches employees from the Burger King Head Office with high school students for a three year career-based mentoring relationship. This November, eight Kipling high school students will be boarding a bus and making their way to the Burger King headquarters in south Etobicoke to meet with their Bigs for a morning of career-based training, activities, and one to one time. The matches will meet in

person once a month until June, and will stay in touch by phone and email in between.

This is an incredible opportunity for our Littles to see what office work is like in one of the few remaining corporations that allows employees to climb the ladder of success without a higher education degree! Our Littles will also have the chance at summer jobs and scholarships.
